To Trust Again: Tiny Big's journey

Tiny Big came into the shelter bearing the physical and mental injuries of broken trust in people. She was a big dog with even bigger feelings. Before she was going to be ready for her forever home, she needed to do some serious work to let go of her past trauma and learn how to trust again. The behaviour team knew that behind that big personality was a dog with a lot of love to give.

After participating in a five-week board and train program outside of the shelter, and spending time in a foster home, Tiny Big was ready for the next step—a staycation. Staycations were developed to help adopters spend time with their prospective pets in their own home. Since animals can find shelter life stressful, this is the perfect way to determine how an animal will behave in a home.

We're happy to report that Tiny's staycation was a success. She's still a work in progress but now her big feelings are shown through goofy smiles and lots of hugs.



WHS in the Community

When an animal is in crisis, the community turns to the WHS. We do everything we can to keep animals with their families through our innovative programs, from the pet food bank to low-cost vet care. We are also out in the community bringing our support directly to the people and pets who need it the most.

Here is a snapshot of how you made a difference in the lives of animals and their families this year:



230 lost animals reunited with their families



4,170 animals found their forever homes



6,240 spay and neuter surgeries performed in shelter



1,609 animal welfare concerns and emergency phone calls



280 animals cared for under emergency and SafePet boarding



24,200 lbs distributed through the pet food bank



167 animals received urgent care



525 animals received dental surgery
